Convention Details

Host Hotel: DoubleTree Hotel, I-25 & Orchard Road, Denver Tech Center. For online info go to www.doubletreedenvertech.com. For phone reservations, call the DoubleTree at 303 779-6161. The Convention rate is \$99.00, and is available two days before and after the actual events.

When making online reservations, use the code COR. If making phone reservations, mention "Corvair" or "Corsa".

Transportation: Naturally, we hope most of our guests arrive in Corvairs, or at least hauling Corvairs. But for those who will travel by air, Denver International Airport is a direct hub for many major airlines, including United, Southwest, and Frontier.

The DoubleTree adjacent to the I-25 corridor and a five-minute walk from a station serving Denver's award-winning RTD Light Rail trains. A few bucks and 20 minutes will put you in the heart of downtown, with no parking worries.

RV & Trailer Parking: RV and trailer parking is available on the hotel property, with overflow arranged in a covered parking garage at a next-door worship center. The overflow lot is a very short walk from the hotel and has ample parking to meet our most optimistic projections!

Camper Hookups: Camper slots are available 15 minutes from the DoubleTree in Cherry Creek Park. Please visit http://parks.state.co.us/Parks/CherryCreek to

make reservations. Pads with hook-ups are booked well in advance, so reserve early to ensure a spot.

Chatfield State Park is a backup location, and is approximately 30-40 minutes from the host hotel, depending on traffic. Visit http://parks.state.co.us/Parks/Chatfield for reservations.

Planning For Weather: Summer weather along the front range is mostly sunny with 80-90° highs offset by low humidity and evenings that typically cool into the 60s.

Brief afternoon cloudbursts are not unknown, but evenings are primo convertible time. A jacket is suggested, and you will definitely want a hat for protection against sunburn. Denver is a mile closer to the sun than at sea level, and it makes a difference you really can feel.

High Plains Drifters - Track Day: On Monday, July 25 we are organizing a track day open to racers and tourers alike at the new High Plains Raceway, one hour east of Denver. Visit www. highplainsraceway.com for track info.

Prices have not been finalized, but will be less than \$100 per lapping entrant. Tourers will be paced, and will have a much lower fee, again still to be determined.

In the old days, I mentally visualized the best picture I could get, because I only had 24 or 36 chances without finding a dark space to swap film rolls. Each picture was precious, and I pushed for visual value with each click of the shutter.

It's things like this that remind me that <sigh> I'm an Old Guy now.

The CONEHEADS Rode Again to Fight Multiple Sclerosis!

Here's an update on my fundraising bike tour to fight Multiple Sclerosis, thanks for your support! I've done it since 1990 = 34 years! The tour was the last weekend in June, rolling from FRCC in Westminster to CSU in Fort Collins, staying overnight and returning Sunday. Team CONEHEADS formed 10 years ago and has grown to 34 riders, with branch teams in other cities. Last year the team reached \$1 million raised cumulatively!



The team goal was \$100,000, and we've raised over \$93,000 so far. My goal of \$2,000 has been met. So I raised it to \$3,000 and have raised \$2,405. If you would still like to sponsor me, I will be at the meeting. I can take cash or checks to National MS Society through July. You can also use the QR code at the right to reach my donation site.



So how did it go? We had a great Saturday start, cool & cloudy to start the day with sun later reaching 82. We gathered for our team picture, then started out together around 6:30am.

I had not trained as much as I would have liked after being sick but would be OK. It wouldn't be fast or pretty, but it would get done without the

"easy route". Everything worked great during training but on Day 1, I had shifting troubles 30 miles in, losing my higher gears. After quick

repair it worked but I suspected I wasn't done with that.

After lunch, I hit a recessed manhole cover and blew my rear tire and had to change a tube. The afternoon

"harder" route heads up through Masonville and drops down to Horsetooth Reservoir, then on to Ft Collins. Mission accomplished, we finished at 2:10pm at 80.41 miles. We settled in dorms and gathered at our team tent for evening. Next year will go from Boulder to Greeley and back after years of same route.

Day 2 I was in line to check air pressure 8 min to planned start and I see a herd of cones roll out early! I buttoned things up and headed off in pursuit, catching them after a couple miles, and aired up at the first stop. The harder route was the climb back up to Horsetooth Reservoir and Masonville, and again it wasn't fast but got done. Things went smoothly for 35 miles, then I had similar shifting problems. I dialed it in so I had all

for 35 miles, then I had similar shifting problems. I dialed it in so I had all but highest gear and kept rolling. The day was hotter reaching 90 and we were eager to finish earlier and beat the heat. Fortunately afternoon intermittent cloud cover helped.



12 miles to end, the source of my shifting problems was apparent when I suddenly had high gear, and nothing else. The shift cable that had probably been wearing and sticking broke leaving 2 gears on the front rings, high and pretty high. With several climbs ahead, these were my opportunities to stand up and pump in a too-high gear! Everyone said I was climbing fast but if I wasn't I wouldn't be able to move. Anyway, day 2 finished at 78.9 miles around 1:40pm, with BBQ and snowcones.

Total was 159.3 miles, 7,700 kcal, 6,612 ft elevation gain, and 13:38 hours. More importantly, \$2,405 raised and \$93K by my team so far. Thank you for your support!







Tech Corner - Don't Get Hosed!

A few quick reminders:

- 1. Gasoline must be transferred from the tank to the carburetor float bowls to run quite a long stretch!
- 2. It must not gush out or splash around during that transfer process.
- 3. Gushing or leaking at any point of the transfer path produces an unintended potential source of direct knowledge about gasoline combustion outside of the cylinders.
- 4. That is **NOT considered to be a good learning option** check your rubber-ish
 hoses for ethanol deterioration and abrasion,
 and metal fittings for leaks.
