Hi all!

While Karen & I did not manage a trip to see the aspens, our autumn purple ash in our front yard has put on quite a display complete with turning the light on the south side of our house yellow. In addition to wrangling the leaves there is to need to winterize our sprinkler systems, remove hoses from outside faucets, get our outdoor plants squared away, plant bulbs, etc.

The other Corvair project I have in mind is to not mess with lawn projects but to work more diligently on the blue car. My daughter's garage has a huge pile of stuff that needs to find its way back onto a car now. Some of the work will be easier when it is not hot out but there is a balance between cooler weather and cold weather.
